he University has successfully completed all projects identified in hase 1. Phase 1 included a wide range f new construction, renovation, open space, and partnership projects. Major new construction projects included the Weiss Pavilion at Franklin Field, the Perelman Center for Advance Medicine, and the Roberts Proton Therapy Center
Major renovation projects included the Music Building, and the third party the Music Building, and the third pa building at 30th and Market Streets. he renovation and repurposing of the US Post Office for the Internal Revenue Service ensured the reuse of an important Philadelphia architectura andmark, providing first class fice space for 5,000 employees in niversity City
hase 1 also included the attraction of private commercial development.

Domus added 420 new beds in a new housing option to the Penn community while enhancing an important pedestrian entrance to the campus. The Radian added 500 beds, marketed to undergraduate students and has The HUB was the first of a three phase private housing project enlivening the 40th Street corrido
